FEDERAL LEGISLATION PROPOSES TO END DISCRIMINATION IN SOCIAL SECURITY BENEFITS FOR SAME-SEX COUPLES

Representative Linda Sanchez, D-Calif., introduced legislation in the Unites States
Congress seeking to end discrimination against same-sex couples when it comes to Social
Security benefits. The proposed legislation would

grant same-sex couples the same Social Security benefits now available to opposite-sex couples.

A rally in support of the measure at the U.S. Capitol last week drew support from celebrities, including actor GeorgeTakei, who played "Mr. Sulu" in the original "Star Trek" television series.

WISCONSIN MEDICAL SOCIETY PASSES TWO PRO-LGBT RESOLUTIONS

At its meeting on April 21, 2012, the Wisconsin Medical Society passed two resolutions favoring the rights and welfare of LGBT people:

RESOLUTION III supports the legal right of civil marriage between any two consenting adults. The resolution recognizes that denying civil marriage based on sexual orientation is discriminatory and contributes to health care disparities affecting same-sex households.

RESOLUTION 203 supports the notion that people and agencies that deal with geriatric populations should be educated about problems, and needs of LGBT and should ask each of their clients if they would like to be informed about resources available for LGBT people.

These two resolutions, among others, will be presented to the American Medical Association at its June, 2012 annual meeting.

SERVICES FOR LGBT OLDER ADULTS: 2012 SURVEY RESULTS

The following is a statement from the National Resource Center on LGBT Aging:

Earlier this year, the National Resource Center on LGBT Aging asked all of you to complete an online survey to help us better understand what resources are working for you and what else we can provide to further improve the lives of LGBT older adults across the country.

In total, nearly 1,000 people took the survey. We learned that the website functions that are most interesting to you are the online locator of LGBT-friendly services, FAQs and fact sheets, links to other websites, and downloadable print materials. This year, we will continue to add to these resources, bringing you information on subjects such as Medicare & Medicaid, health and wellness, and elder abuse.

We also saw encouraging results from those who identified as aging services providers— 90% reported that sexual orientation is included in their agencies' nondiscrimination policy and 64% include gender identity protections. Also, 69% reported that they speak at LGBT events or programs.

From those who identify as working or volunteering at LGBT organizations, 80% reported that their agencies co-sponsor or provide speakers for local events and programs for older adults. And, 72% reported that their organizations offer programs and support groups for older adults.

All of these results show improvements from our 2011 survey!
