Believing that all people have a right to basic human dignity, she dreamed of such an organization in our community for years before the realization of her vision. During

those formative years, despite working full-time, she organized meetings and other activities with only a handful of LGBT residents of the area. Her dream was realized with the founding of the organization in 1995.

But that's not where her tireless efforts ended. She served as president of the fledgling organization for its first 16 years, striving to increase membership in a variety of ways, not the least of which was the publication of a monthly newsletter for which she assumed full responsibility. There were times when she was the lone voice for gay, lesbian, bisexual, transgender and intersex issues in our community. Today, the membership of Door County PFLAG has grown considerably, and from a monthly newsletter, the organization's publications have increased to over 150 e-mail and postal mail communications a month.

In addition to the published materials, she has promoted awareness of LGBT issues by sponsoring an information



sharing booth at "Pride Alive" in Green Bay, an annual event. For many years, she has spread the word of the organization by staffing a stand at the Farmer's Market every Saturday in the heart of Sturgeon Bay, circulating brochures and other information about

the organization and about LGBT issues. And when not recruiting volunteers for the Saturday morning activity, she was womaning the stand herself. Sandy has personally shared her time and resources with many individuals and families needing support.

Social justice embodies the vision of communities that are not only equitable, but in which all members are physically and psychologically safe. Over the years Sandy has been an advocate for the LGBT community at meetings and events of community agencies (Sexual Assault Center, HELP) focusing on physical, sexual, and psychological abuse. She reminds us all that violence occurs not only in heterosexual relationships, but homosexual relationships as well.

For many years Sandy has been a member and board member of the LWV of Door County; she is that organization's current president. As a League member, Sandy has paid focus to many social issues, including the recent formation of the Door County Civility Project, a community-based initiative whose mission is to foster and incorporate the principles of civility into the fabric of everyday life.

Jack Dixon once said, "If you focus on results, you will never change. If you focus on change, you will get results." Due to Sandy's diligent efforts and focus on the changes needed here, many of the members of the LGBT community have seen change. They do enjoy the freedom and welcoming spirit of our great community. What had been hidden has now become open, giving, and inclusive, thanks in large part to this one woman's efforts for social justice! The entire community, not only those in the LGBT community, has benefited from her vision, her tireless work, and bravery.
