Wisconsin Voter Photo ID

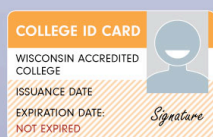
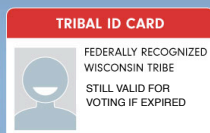
What you need to know.



All Wisconsin citizens must present a photo ID to vote in person on Election Day, to vote early in person at the clerk's office, and (for most voters) to vote absentee by mail.

You must show one of these IDs

Address on your ID does not have to be current!



Your college ID card **MUST** have all of the following to be used for voting:

- Photo
- Signature
- Issuance Date
- Expiration date * that is not expired

*Your school must be a WI accredited college

*Cannot be more than 2 years after card's date of issue



PROOF OF ENROLLMENT

Proof of Enrollment varies for each college. It is a separate document (may be electronic), such as a class schedule or enrollment verification form.

If you are not sure about your proof of enrollment, please ask your college.

Frequently Asked Questions

What if I don't have an acceptable photo ID?

Voting is a right you can't afford to lose.

Do I need a photo ID if I vote absentee?

You **must** include a copy of your acceptable voter photo ID when you send in your signed absentee ballot request. The only exceptions are: if you are indefinitely confined due to age or disability; live in a nursing home or senior residential community; or are a permanent overseas or military voter.

What if the address on my photo ID isn't current?

An acceptable Voter Photo ID **does not** have to include a current address.

Important things to remember:

- ★ There is **not** a separate "Voter Photo ID card." You can use any of the examples pictured on this page as a Voter Photo ID.
- ★ Note the expiration and issuance **date requirements** for acceptable IDs.
- ★ **The name on your photo ID does NOT have to exactly match the name you use to vote.** Nicknames (e.g., "Susan" with ID for "Sue") are OK! However, if you've legally changed your name, your new name must be on the ID you use to vote.

Here's how to Get a Free Voter Photo ID

Go to your **local Division of Motor Vehicles (DMV) service center**.

(Find the location of your local DMV at: <http://wisconsin.gov/Pages/online-srvcs/find-dmv>)

Bring your **social security number** (doesn't have to be your SS Card) and *original* documents that prove your name and date of birth; your identity; U.S. Citizenship; and Wisconsin residency (*see lists below*).

Fill out a "Wisconsin Identification Card" application.

Documents needed to get a Free Voter Photo ID

Bring one from each of the following four categories (originals, no photo copies).

Documents in **bold** can be used as proof in more than one category (e.g., Birth Certificate).

Name and Date of Birth:

- **Birth Certificate (certified)**
- **Certificate of Citizenship**
- Court Order (Adoption, Divorce, Name or Gender Change)
- **Certificate of Naturalization**

Proof of U.S. Citizenship:

- **U.S. Birth Certificate (certified)**
- **Certificate of Citizenship**
- **Certificate of Naturalization**

Proof of Identity:

- Marriage or Divorce Certificate
- Social Security Card
- Driver's License (Other U.S. State)
- State ID Card (Other U.S. State)
- U.S. Gov. & Military Dependent Card
- Military Discharge Papers (including Federal DD-214)

Wisconsin Residency (*must show name and address*):

- Utility Bill (e.g., Cable, Phone)*
- Bank/Financial Institution Statement*
- Pay Stub*
- Insurance Policy dated within last year
- Gov. Issued Correspondence issued within the last year
- Mortgage Documents for WI Property

*Issued within the last 90 days

**Bring ONE
from each
category!**

If you don't have the required documents to prove U.S. Citizenship, name and date of birth, and/or legal name change, **you can still get a free ID**, but you must:

Be a U.S. Citizen, indicate that **the ID card is required free of charge for the purposes of voting**; and **fill out a short form** claiming that documents required to prove U.S. Citizenship, name and date of birth and/or legal name change are unavailable and require a fee to a government agency to obtain.

What College & University Students need to know

To vote in any election in Wisconsin, you **MUST** present an **acceptable Photo ID**

Address on your photo ID **does not have to be current!**



You can use your unexpired Student Photo ID Card

If it was issued by an accredited Wisconsin university or college (All UW System schools and most private colleges in Wisconsin are accredited!)

And it contains:

- Date Issued
- An **expiration** date *no later than two years* after date of issuance
- Your Signature

You must also bring

Or **display electronically** at the polls (on a cell phone/tablet/laptop) a separate document that **proves enrollment, such as:**

- Enrollment Verification Form
- Class schedule
- Tuition Bill

Or you can use your:

WI Driver's License or State ID Card
(Unexpired or expired after 11/4/2014)

US Passport
(Unexpired or expired after 11/4/2014)

Military ID Card
(Unexpired or expired after 11/4/2014)

ID Card from federally-recognized WI Tribe (Can be expired)

Certificate of Naturalization
(Issued within 2 years prior to election)

Receipt for Driver's License or State ID Card
(Valid for 45 days)

Voting is a right you can't afford to lose.

If your Student ID isn't acceptable, ask your school for an ID that complies – or use one of the IDs above.

Don't Wait – Register to Vote Now!

Go to **MyVote.WI.gov** and follow the instructions for submitting your registration form and proof of residency. Or you can register at your clerk's office, or even at your local polling place on Election Day, if you bring acceptable proof of identity and Wisconsin residency.

Save time and hassle.

Register now, so you don't miss your chance to have a voice in the future of our democracy!
